






Teens in the Media PFEQSec Gycle TWO pg 12 (an example)

How teenagers are represented in the media?

- by reinvesting their understanding of a variety of media texts (e.g. <u>TV commercials</u>, <u>newspaper articles</u>, <u>Web sites</u>).
- 2) Students cooperate to investigate (WIKI example)
- and compare that representation with their own reality.
- 4) They then <u>produce their own media text</u> depicting how they think teens could be more realistically portrayed.
- 5) Students come to know themselves better and gain an appreciation for how other teens live.

Respond




- students examine <u>TV commercials</u> <u>II</u>, print advertisements, radio spots, etc. and create their own media texts,
- they develop <u>critical judgment</u> based on how the media represent teenagers. (Through the use of the response process, they become familiar with some of the features of these texts)
- use their knowledge of media-related materials (e.g. digital camera, publishing software) and communication codes (e.g. sound, image) to produce media texts illustrating their own reality.



Produce

- students determine the message they wish to express.
 (<u>research</u>, <u>organizers</u>, <u>collaborate online</u>)
- 2) decide on the medium/format and
- 3) what type of language would best achieve their purpose and reach their audience.
- 4) Make a <u>storyboard for a short film, write a script for a radio spot, design a poster, etc.</u>
- 5) Prior to presenting a final version of their media text, students make adjustments, <u>taking others' feedback</u> <u>into account</u>.

Seccone: Earth Day

- <u>Students decide</u> they want to see if they can make a difference in their milieu.
- They research forms of pollution that interest them.
- They e-mail a letter to an expert using a writing process guided by the teacher.
- They set up candid camera shots to see how others react to types of pollution

Sec C One: Earth Day

- They use a production process to prepare a campaign of posters, brochures, top ten lists, etc. to sensitize the milieu.
- After a certain time, the students again take candid camera shots under the same conditions to see if their campaign has been successful.
- Another possibility an anti-pollution newsletter/brochure

Process

- Look at other examples, (other videos, podcasts, texts, etc.) (work on a strategy - e.g. skim & scan text, infer meaning)... link to the examples using Fleck and Trailfire.
- Look at resources, reference material (teacher created ...) Organize using IGOOGLE – ZOHO
- Create roles with specific activities to Jigsaw coop share digitally (post...)
- Work on language the vocabulary, functional language (expressions, useful sentences and questions) (references, puzzles, exercises and quizzes)
- Discuss in class and out "ask an expert" video conference, poll or survey others, ...

Process ...(2)

- Share ideas and resources Wiki Blog FaceBook
- Use an organizer bubble.us, thinkature or a Timeline (story plot) to organize and discuss ideas.
- Choose a medium a poster, presentation, digital scrapbook, etc.
- Add a musical element for feeling, impact, ...
- Create / play a game
- Provide links to "how to" information (templates, etc) or develop a "how to" using a digital medium.


Teacher & Student using ICT's



Teacher's suggested ingredients in a PLN

- My first recommendation is that you read what <u>Sue Waters has written about PLN's</u>. Sue isn't an ESL/EFL/ELL teacher, but she provides an essential step-by-step guide for how any educator can get started.
- One of my favorites is EFL Classroom 2.0. Begun by David Deubelbeiss, it's an extraordinary collection of every imaginable ESL/EFL resource, and helps connect teachers from all over the world.
- Learning With Computers is an exceptional group of ESL/EFL teachers from around the world that was begun
 by Gladys Baya. It's part of <u>Webheads In Action</u>, which has helped start several similar collaborations.
 Learning With Computers has a <u>very helpful Wiki</u> and an equally helpful, and active, <u>listserv</u>. Another great
 Webheads group and listserv is called <u>evonline</u>.
- Two more listservs worth joining are <u>The Computer-Assisted Language Learning listserv</u> from TESL and the <u>National Institute For Literacy's Technology Discussion List</u>.
- <u>EFL Teaching Recipes</u> is an extremely accessible site where ESL/EFL teachers can share their lessons, including video and images. It's just beginning, and I'm sure it'll be filled-up with with ideas quickly. Go over and contribute some, as well as read the excellent ones that are already there!
- Burcu Akyol has put together an <u>excellent list of ESL/EFL teachers</u> you can follow on Twitter and <u>Shelly Terrell</u>
 has done the same.
- <u>TEFL.net</u> is a worldwide forum with discussion boards, jobs listings, and a ton of other resources.
- If you have a blog, you might want to consider connecting with "Bloggers in ELT, freelancers." It's a group begun by Karenne Sylvester, and you can <u>read all about it here</u>.
- Of course, <u>TESOL</u>, the association of Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages, is a huge international organization with lots of resources. It is also one of two resources on this list that costs to join, but it does offer reduced rates depending on your situation.

The Best Ways To Create Online Content Easily & Quickly

- Number seventeen is: <u>BECOME A TALKING STAR TREK CHARACTER</u>: Using the text-to-speech feature, <u>choose a Star Trek character</u> and have him/her speak, then post it on a student/teacher website.
- Number sixteen is: <u>DESIGN A WEIRD BACKYARD</u>: Create a decorative backyard, write a
 message using the text-to-speech feature, and post the link to your <u>Eddiegram</u> on website or
 send it to a friend.
- Number fifteen is: <u>MAKE A QUILT ONLINE:</u> The International Quilt Study Center & Museum lets users create their own quilt. They can then email the link to a friend and/or post the link on a teacher or student website or blog
- Number fourteen is: <u>CREATE A "PHOTROPISM":</u> At <u>Phototropism</u> you "create sculptures that react like plants to weather conditions." You can then email the link for posting. It's cool in a very weird sort of way.
- Number thirteen is: <u>SEND A TALKING MESSAGE FROM A CHEETAH</u>: Type in a message, and then have <u>Chester Cheetah</u> use a text-to-voice feature to say what you've written. Next, email your message so the link can be posted on a website or blog. Better yet, try using <u>Embedit.in</u> so you can embed in your webpage any student-created work that only provides a url address
- Number twelve is: <u>CREATE A DATA VISUALIZATION</u>: The New York Times Visualization Lab looks like it's going to be a fascinating place to visit periodically. It provides data the newspaper gathers (it looks like they are adding new information regularly) and then users can choose from a variety of different options to "visualize" it. You're then provided a link and an embed code for your creation. Students could then post it on their own website and describe it. Not only can this be a neat place for English Language Learners to gain a better understanding and analysis of current events through the use of visuals, but it can also offer them higher-order thinking opportunities to try and identify which form of visualization portrays a more accurate perspective

The Best Ways To Create Online Content Easily & Quickly

- Number eleven is: <u>MAKE A "BEAUTIFUL CONNECTON"</u>: Nokia lets you <u>choose an artistic</u> <u>creation</u>, type a message that goes with it, and then make an audio recording. You can then email and post the url of the final result on a website.
- Number ten is: <u>PUT A CAPTION BUBBLE ON AN IMAGE</u>: <u>Caption Bubble</u> lets you very easily find an image on the web and add a text caption bubble. The link can then be emailed and/or posted on a student or teacher blog. I've posted about this site before, but it appears to have gotten even better. You can find many other similar tools on my website at <u>Student Photos</u>.
- Number nine is: **WRITE A FORTUNE FOR A FORTUNE COOKIE:** <u>Unfortunate</u> lets you do just that. There are other similar web applications out there, but those seemed to have example fortunes that were inappropriate for the classroom.
- Number eight is: <u>DRAW A PICTURE (& TYPE TEXT)</u>: Any Canvas lets you draw something, and includes a lot of "bells and whistles." You can type in text as well, and post the link to your creation on a blog or website.
- Number seven is: <u>BECOME A TALKING POTATO</u>: With <u>Spud Yourself!</u> you can turn your image into a talking potato (or use one of the site's pictures). By using the text-to-speech feature, English Language Learners can develop their language skills in a fun way through writing and listening. You can post the link to your talking potato on a teacher or student blog/website.
- Number six is: <u>SEND A HEALTHY E-CARD</u>: The Centers For Disease Control have a <u>huge</u> <u>collection of E-Cards related to health</u>. You can add your own message, email it to a friend/teacher, and then post the url on a website or blog.

The Best Ways To Create Online Content Easily & Quickly (of 17)

- Number five is: <u>CREATE A NEAT-LOOKING ESSAY OUTLINE</u>: <u>aMaps</u> let you create a visualization of a basic essay form state your position and provide reasons, along with examples. After completing a scaffolded outline, you're provided with a pretty neat looking visual picture of what you've developed, along with the embed code. You can also email the link to a friend or teacher for posting on a blog or website, and then people can respond to what you wrote.
- Number four: <u>CREATE AN INFORMATIONAL MAP</u>: <u>Show/World & Show/USA</u> (which are on <u>The Best Map-Making Sites On The Web list</u>) lets you create visual representations of information using maps. Students can then embed their creations on their blog/website and describe what they've done.
- Number three is: **CREATE A TALKING ANIMAL:** Talking Pets lets you do it. You can choose a pet picture, or upload your own. Then, using the text-to-speech feature, you can have it say a short message, then email the link for posting on a blog or website.
- Number two is: <u>WRITE A PICTURE STORY:</u> <u>Five Card Flickr Story</u> lets you pick five photos from a group of pre-selected images from Flickr and then write a story about them. It saves your selection and story, and provides you with a link to it. No registration is required.
- And, now, the Number one tool to create online content easily and quickly is: <u>POST</u>
 <u>ANYTHING ONLINE IN SECONDS: File2.ws</u> lets you, without registering, quickly upload any document and turn it into a webpage. This is an extraordinary tool. You can see <u>examples</u> of how my students used it to create multilingual materials on swine-flu prevention. Students can create anything, for example, using Microsoft Word, and immediately turn it into a webpage

A podcast has a news feed (known as RSS) that allows it to be cataloged in various podcasting directories like iTunes and Podcast Pickle. The popular directory, Podcast Alley, has cataloged over 41,000 podcasts and nearly 2million individual episodes. If you are interested in listening to the podcasts mentioned here, launch iTunes and type the name into the search field.
